

The house points competition is coming to an exciting end, with Chadwick taking a slim lead over Elkhart this week. Which house will take this year's crown?





You can download the app for your iPad or use the internet to access the site.




## The Bridge Community Hub

#### **CAREERS**

Being interviewed for a job can be intimidating and preparation is essential. You should research the company, decide on what you are wearing and prepare on how you are going to get there. You should also think about the questions you might be asked. Here are some of the toughest questions and advice on how to answer them.

Tough Job

Q. Tell me about a time you had a conflict and how you managed it

What they're really asking: This is a classic interview question that is looking to establish how you work with teammates and customers and how well you resolve problems that may arise.

What to consider: Focus on key qualities such as leadership and cooperation and what the positive outcomes of this situation were.

Q. What have you learned from someone or something recently in your life?

What they're really asking: Employees are often expected to be lifelong learners and always looking for ways to improve.

What to consider: Learning independently shows the curiosity that they are seeking. A love of learning is really important, so show enthusiasm for expanding your knowledge.

Q. Can you give us an example of a time that you had to overcome an obstacle to achieve your goal?

What they're really asking: This is a really common question and can be applied to anything from web development to marketing to the service industry. This question aims to understand your problem-solving skills, understand how you communicate, and your resourcefulness and resilience.

What to consider: Focus on the positive, rather than the negative, focus on key qualities such as teamwork and ingenuity.
