House points

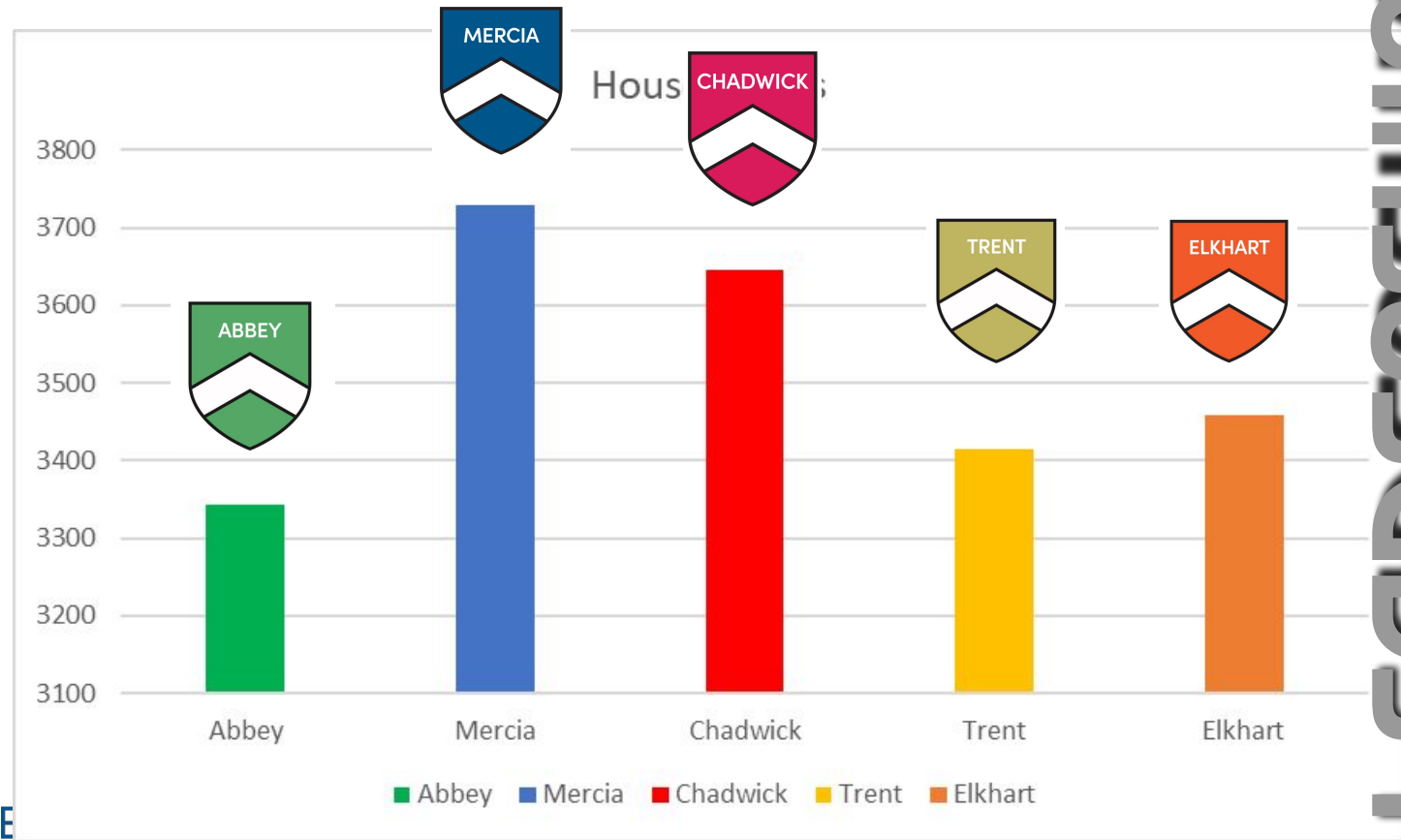

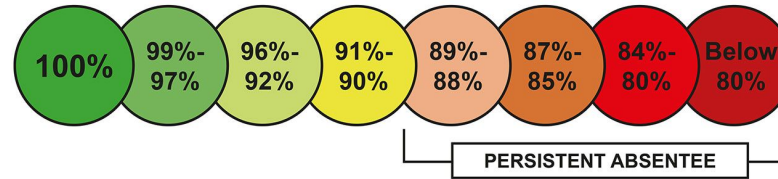


