

Students have been learning about electrical charges and used the Van der Graaf Generator. This is Ruby W having a hair raising time.

Year 8 Mr Eades

Some Year 8 Classes have had a go at making their own salt, but this wasn't the same salt you put on your fish and chips. They used a black powder called copper oxide which reacted with sulphuric acid. They heated these substances over a bunsen burner to create a salt called copper sulphate. Copper sulphate is a blue coloured salt and would be harmful to human health if swallowed.



Mercia continue their comfortable lead and seem set to finish the first term with the most house points. Can any other houses make a dent in their lead before the Christmas break?








Remember you can earn house points in a number of ways:

As a result, we have set our school target for attendance at **96%** and expect all pupils to achieve this.
