**Dear Parents and Carers**

Our Year 11s get the results from their mock exams next Friday and these results will also be sent home to you. We will then start the individual conversations with them about what they need to do to improve to ensure they maximise their achievement in the summer.

I spoke with the staff at the school on the INSET Day about the fact that I turn 50 this year and as such I want to make this the best year ever, both personally and in school. I hope I can count on your support to ensure that this is the case at Abbot Beyne School.
